

SECURITY CONCERNS

Due to the number of reported car prowls the Security Committee recommends the following to reduce your risk of becoming a victim:

- Keep home and vehicle doors locked
- Keep garage doors closed
- Keep outdoor lights on
- Reduce deserted property appearance
 - Pick up mail, packages, newspapers promptly
 - Keep blinds open
- Remove garbage cans from the curb same day as waste pick-up

Emails from Vantage

When the Vantage Property Management office emails Indian Summer residents the email will be coming from TACOMA HOA. This has confused residents and sometimes emails are going directly into Junk Mail Folders. Vantage is looking into how they might change their email address but until then please be aware of the issue and follow the steps below.

Add new senders' email addresses to your email address book. Messages from senders who are in your address book won't go into the junk folder.

If a message is already in the junk folder, click on it and select the option to label the message as "Not Junk" or something similar. When prompted, select the option to add the sender's email address to your address book or to a "Safe" list, which will keep future emails From going into your junk folder.

This is a reminder to all dog walkers... Please be a responsible pet owner and buy your own pet waste bags and use them to dispose of your pet's waste in your own home's trash can. Guests should bring their own bags as well, or use a plastic bag supplied by you. The 10 pet waste containers in our neighborhood are now numbered and they are there for unexpected times when needed. They
